Each semester we choose a theme to guide and unite our curriculum, while helping build community between classes. Last semester we studied **perspective**, leading to greater understanding of and empathy for others. This semester, inspired by our musical, <u>The Lion King, Kids</u>, we are focused on the **Circle of Life**, and how we are all a part of one great whole.

In preparation for <u>The Lion King, Kids</u>, we are learning a few Zulu and Swahili words, languages spoken in southern and south-eastern Africa. Language tells us much about a culture, as each person's world-view is shaped by the words they have to describe it. From Zulu, we get the concept of "**Ubuntu**," often translated as "I am, because we are." In other words, in this great circle of life, I exist because others exist; I am, only because I am dependent upon and responsible for others.

Art of all forms, like language, allow us to make sense of our world. This semester, as your children learn to make art in their Seaside classes, they are also learning their place in our community. They will see that in all of their overlapping communities—Seaside Arts Center, Carmel Valley, San Diego, California, peer groups, school, etc.—they are both dependent upon and responsible for others.

Thank you for being part of our circle, our community at Seaside. We take to heart sincerely that we are both dependent upon you, our families, and responsible for providing your children with the best arts education available. This semester, we will live the spirit of "**Ubuntu**" in all we do at Seaside.



Safety Protocols & Policies



Drop Off/Pick Up for 10 Years & Under

DROP OFF: Please park and bring your child into the building. Do not leave until a faculty member has checked in your student.

PICK UP: Please make eye contact or speak directly with a faculty member when picking up your student from class. Please let a faculty member know before class if someone else will be picking up your child.

Teachers/staff can NEVER drive a student due to insurance regulations.



Bullying and Disrespectful Behavior

Seaside Arts Center has zero tolerance for bullying. Negative behaviors during class time may result in a meeting with the student, instructor, and parent. Continued negative behavior may result in removal from the program without a refund.



Concerns

If a minor makes a dangerous report to a Seaside Arts Center representative, we may be required to report it.

Health Policies

Help Us Keep Each Other Healthy

At Seaside Arts Center we are working hard to ensure a safe and positive experience for all of our staff and families. This includes keeping the studio clean, washing hands frequently, providing hand sanitizer, and running a HEPA air purifier.

All staff and students should stay home if they are not feeling well or exhibit any of the following symptoms:

- Fever over 100.4 F or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath/ difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches

- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion/runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

There are no refunds for missed classes, but make-up classes are encouraged. Students may make-up missed classes by attending any class that is appropriate for their age. Please discuss with your student's teacher or Seaside staff for recommendations.

Studio Policies

Attendance

Regular attendance is vital to the learning process. Please adhere to the following guidelines:

- Always alert Seaside faculty of missed classes in advance by submitting an absence notification in the Parent Portal.
- For private lessons, if a student misses 2+ lessons without giving notice, they may be withdrawn without a refund.
- Please arrive on time for all classes. Beyond being disruptive for other students, many classes are structured to properly warm-up students and prepare for rigorous activities. Late arrivals may be invited to watch but may not participate.
- If a student misses a class, please speak to the teacher so they do not fall behind. Make up classes are encouraged.
- If a student misses 3+, they may not be able to participate in performances.
- If a student misses class in the 2 weeks before a performance, they may be removed from parts/pieces.
- Please pick up your student promptly at the end of class. Teachers are not able to babysit.
- If an emergency prevents prompt pick-up, contact Elyssa Rosenberg immediately at (914) 260-9889.

Class Policies

These policies are in addition to those shared by faculty members for individual classes.

- Students must bring their own water bottles.
- No gum!
- Students must always be respectful of faculty and peers.
- No smart watches or phones allowed in class. Please leave them in cubbies.
- Students must use the restroom before class to limit class disruptions.

Ballet Uniforms

Ballet is a traditional and codified art form. Ballet uniforms teach students to dress in a way that acknowledges and pays homage to these traditions.

Also, the different leotard colors give students visual goals to measure their progress as ballet dancers. Please help us maintain this tradition by ensuring that your children arrive to Ballet in the appropriate uniform and with their hair properly tied back.

Showcase Costumes

Because performance participation is a mandatory part our curriculum, all costumes (when applicable) are provided. We ask that while borrowing our costumes, you treat them with respect, refrain from eating in them, and return them in the condition in which they were given to you.

No additional fees for registration, performances, or costumes. The only additional costs are for class uniforms (if applicable) and performance tickets.

We do not prorate tuition for holidays or breaks as they are factored into the pricing. No refunds for missed classes. Students may make-up absences by attending other classes they are eligible for.

Discounts

- **Multi-Class Discount:** 15% Off total when you enroll in 2+ class/lesson. (Prices in red above!)
- **Military Discount:** 15% Off all classes and lessons. (Can't combine with Multi-Cass Discount)
- Cash/Check Discount: Addtional 3% off



Payments

All families must enroll their students through the Parent Portal. If you are not paying in full, the first month's tuition will be charged upon registration to secure the student(s)' spot(s), and the additional payments will be processed on or around February 1, March 1, April 1, and May 1.

Please note: The Parent Portal defaults to showing the **monthly fees**, without showing any discounts, which will be applied after enrollment

We also accept cash, check (made out to Seaside Arts Center), Venmo, or Paypal. If paying via one of these methods, payment must be received by the 1st of the month, or your credit card will be charged. Payments not received by the 5th will incur an additional \$40 late fee.

Unlimited Class Plan

For the 2024 - 2025 school year, when you pay for four weekly classes for one child, all additional classes for that child are FREE! Classes can be paid in full at registration or via monthly payments. Can only be combined with Cash/Check 3% Discount. Siblings' classes are eligible for the Multi-Class Discount. (Master Classes and workshops not included.)

\$25 TUITION CREDIT FOR REFERRALS

We would LOVE for your friends and family to join us at Seaside! Earn a \$25 tuition credit, good toward future camp or tuition payments, when a friend enrolls in ANY Seaside class and lets us know you referred them! (Students cannot have previously enrolled in a Seaside camp or class.) Spring enrollment closes March 17, 2025.

Performances

We view participation in performances as critical to student's growth and ability to have a full performing arts experience, therefore performance and costume fees are included into the semester's tuition and participation is expected.

However, if an alternate class cannot be found and a student or family must withdraw from Seaside Arts Center, we require 30 days written notice prior to the withdrawal date.

A prorated tuition credit or refund will be issued based on the withdrawal date.
