

SEASIDE SHOWCASE FAQ'S

- **Where can I find info about my child's performance?**

 - The website is the go-to place for all show info, but keep an eye on your email as updates will be sent out regularly as performances approach.
- **Do I need to purchase tickets?**
 - Yes! Tickets to all performances are on sale now. [Click here](#) to purchase.
- **Is my child performing twice?**
 - Children in Early Childhood classes and private lessons perform once. All other dancing, singing, and acting classes perform twice.
- **Why are they performing twice?**
 - When theater scheduling allows, we present each production twice because repetition deepens learning.
 - The first performance helps students manage nerves, apply preparation, and experience sharing their work with an audience.
 - By the second performance, students often show greater confidence, stronger stage presence, and deeper artistic connection.
 - Research shows that repetition strengthens long-term memory, technical skill, and creative expression. A second performance also reinforces confidence, resilience, communication, and emotional growth.
- **Are parents expected to buy tickets twice?**
 - Performing twice gives parents an opportunity to watch one full show, as well as volunteer backstage for the second show to share that experience with their child.
 - You are also welcome to watch both shows, just one show, or split up and have some family members attend each show - whichever works best for your family and student.
- **Do I need to pick up my child during the student breaks on performance days?**
 - YES! Students should be picked up and dropped off again from the Student Check out entrance on Juniper. There are lots of local restaurants nearby to grab a quick bite to eat before the second call time. There will NOT be staff available to monitor them during the break.
- **Does my child need to have hair and make-up done and undergarments on for the rehearsals?**
 - For rehearsals at Seaside, NO.
 - For rehearsals at the Grand | Ritz, YES! They should come as they would to their shows, with full hair and make-up done, as well as the appropriate undergarments on, and all shoes labeled and with them.
- **Can my child wear jewelry or nail polish for the performances?**
 - For safety and a cohesive look for each class, no nail polish or jewelry is allowed for performers.
